Groom and Bride repeat after the Minister one at the time (Option B):

I _____, choose you _____, to be my wife/husband, to share all of my life with you. It's responsibilities and its freedoms, it's tensions and its trials. It's joys and it's pleasures. To cherish, to love, to honour, and to respect. This is my heart's promise to you.

The exchange of rings

The wedding bands have a very important meaning in the life of a couple because they not only remind us of the life-long commitments we live by, but anyone who looks at our hand knows that we belong to another person and that special person lives in our heart.

Groom and Bride place the rings on each other's hand and repeat after the Officiant (Option A):

_____, with this ring, I wed you, in the name of love, loyalty and commitment.

Groom and Bride place the rings on each other's hand and repeat after the Officiant (Option B):

_____, with all my love I give you this ring, a symbol of the vows we have made to each other and as a token of my love.

May these rings be for you a symbol of the unbroken circle of love. A love freely given that has no beginning and no end. May these rings remind you always of the promises you have made to each other today.

Pronouncement

_____ and _____, in as much as you have declared your willingness to be united in marriage, and have signified the same by pledging yourselves to one another in the presence of these witnesses, by the joining of hands and by the exchange of rings; therefore, I, by the power vested in me by his Majesty King Charles III, the government of the province of Ontario and the Marriage Act, am honoured and delighted to pronounce you husband and wife!
